Moreton Hall is situated an area of considerable beauty with excellent road and rail links both to the North and South. It is situated midway between Shrewsbury and Chester.

Teaching is delivered to a high standard across all areas of the school. The EAL programme operates from Reception to Year 12, in our well established ISC pre-sessional A Level and GCSE programmes, as well as in our bespoke Summer School courses.

The successful candidate will be an excellent communicator, inspiring teacher and highly motivated to teach international students.
