General Information

Pujiang is a new city, built in an Italian style. The area comprises of a shopping mall, new apartment blocks, the new school and offices and businesses. Old Pujiang is located about 30 minutes away. The nearest railway station is 13 miles away and has a fast train to Shanghai, which takes around 1 hour 30 minutes. Shanghai International airport has direct flights to London Heathrow or there are connecting flights to Manchester. The total journey time to Manchester is around 14 hours, depending upon the connection time.

Accommodation will be provided close to the school. Driving in China is not to be recommended but taxis are very cheap and easy to get. Trains are also very good value and internal flights to other parts of China from Shanghai are inexpensive. Hotels can also be very cheap. The cost of living in China is cheaper than in the UK so you will find your money goes further.
